FACILITIES BOND PROGRAM REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY - SPRING 2006

"Build it and they will come."

That promise from a popular book and movie about an enchanted baseball field also has become a reality — with an academic bent — on the college campuses of the North Orange County Community College District.

On one of the campuses, students waited anxiously in line outside the day their new Library/Learning Resource Center opened its doors for the first time. Student interest and use has increased significantly since Fullerton College and Cypress College completed their new L/LRCs this past year.

While there have been many challenges to work around during the past few years, District students as well as staff and community members are beginning to enjoy some finished results in the NOCCCD Bond Facilities Program. To date, 17 projects have been completed or are near complete in the \$239 Measure X program approved by voters in 2002. (Please see accompanying chart for details.)

This progress has been possible because of "great collaboration" both inside and outside the District, explains Ron Beeler, District Director, Facilities Control. The executive teams on each campus are involved on a day-to-day basis with their individual campus construction managers who, in turn, work closely with the District program manager and the District Facilities Department.

Beeler also says the District has a good working relationship with the Department of the State Architect, which must review all building plans for safety and access compliance. District architects are held to high standards to meet DSA requirements, which helps in speeding up the review and approval process in that state office.

Additionally, like other community college districts in the state, the NOCCCD has worked through escalating costs in the construction market brought on by high demand for both materials and labor during the past two years in particular. Despite these unexpected challenges, as well as the many expected challenges in a major construction program like the NOCCCD's, Beeler offers a big smile.

"Our program definitely is alive and thriving," he concludes, just days before another new building groundbreaking ceremony on one of the District campuses.

Facilities Bond Program Citizens' Oversight Committee

The NOCCCD Citizens' Oversight Committee meets four times a year to review the District's compliance with the voter-approved plans for Measure X funds. In addition, the Committee is responsible for overseeing an annual audit. The 2004-05 audit recently was completed by the firm of Macias Gini & Company, which reported that the District's use of bond funds was aligned with voter-approved projects.

The Citizens' Oversight Committee is comprised of members who represent different segments of the community. Members of the Committee during 2005-06 were: Darrell Essex-Committee Chair, Tatyana Alvarez, Don Baldwin, Mary Bouas, Theresa Harvey, Rowland Hill, Julie Law, and George Tsuda.

North Orange County Community College District Bond-Funded Projects

The NOCCCD presented a list of 22 major building construction and renovation project areas in 2002 When it asked voters to approve Measure X, providing \$239 million in bond money to the District. After approval of Measure X, District administrators, faculty, and other staff members began looking at the possibility of a variety of individual projects in the 22 major project areas. However, challenges that included dramatic increases in construction costs have made it necessary to prioritize and even downsize the list of projects.
