To Our Community

As Chair of the Measure X Citizens' Oversight Committee, I am pleased to report that the North Orange County Community College District (NOCCCD) is nearly completed with almost all of the major projects of the bond program. Approved by the voters in March 2002, Measure X provided \$239 million for the improvement and expansion of college and continuing education facilities to ensure the best possible educational opportunities for the District's residents and businesses. Out of the 22 initial major projects, only one remains under construction: Fullerton College's Technology Complex which includes buildings 700 and 900. When finished, these buildings will house the permanent spaces for the Administration of Justice, welding, cosmetology, automotive, and machining programs, among others.

One of the things the Committee and I are most proud of is how District staff has been able to stretch the bond dollars far beyond the original scope. By leveraging state capital outlay money, they have effectively turned the initial \$239 million from Measure X into almost half a billion dollars of construction equity. As an example of this, the Fullerton College 700 building, when completed, will have been built with only 10% Measure X funds. 90% of the cost was paid for with state capital outlay dollars, for which we competed against all of the other 71 community college school districts. Examples of other bond projects completed with state capital outlay assistance include: the Fullerton College Science building, the Cypress College Humanities remodel, and the libraries for both colleges.

This is just one example of NOCCCD's leadership and conscientious management of Measure X dollars. Another is the District's commitment to transparency throughout this development process. As required by Proposition 39, the Citizen's Oversight Committee has had complete access to all expenditures authorized by Measure X so that we may ensure these funds are spent only on facility improvements. We have reviewed the expenditures and projects, and find the NOCCCD is in compliance with the requirement of the California Constitution and all actions are consistent with the language approved by voters in Measure X local bond measure.

Thank you again for your support and investment in NOCCCD's premier institutions: Cypress College, Fullerton College, and the School of Continuing Education. The funding provided by Measure X has ensured that quality higher education remains in our communities for generations to come.
