CSEA and its Chapter #167 (pending ratification from their membership), DMA, the Confidentials Group, and Executive Officers have reached two-year agreements with the District, for the 2016-17 and 2017-18 academic years. They will go to the NOCCCD Board of Trustees for approval on July 14, 2016.

Sold! Measure J Bonds Hit the Market

On June 2, the District sold the first \$100 million in general obligation bonds of the Measure J Bond Program.

Underwritten by Morgan Stanley and Piper Jaffray, the highly successful sale brought an average interest cost of 2.545%, close to the historical low rate for bonds of this nature.

Planning is currently taking place at the campuses, with the first Board-approved project— Cypress College's new Science, Engineering, and Math Building—slated to break ground in the winter of 2017.
