To Our Community

The Measure X Citizen's Oversight Committee and I are pleased to announce that all major projects of the bond program are now complete. Approved by the voters in March 2002, Measure X provided \$239 million for the improvement and expansion of college and continuing education facilities to ensure the best possible educational opportunities for the District's residents and businesses. 22 major projects were completed or addressed during the term of the bond, renovating and updating facilities at all three of our institutions: Cypress College, Fullerton College, and the School of Continuing Education.

The Fullerton College Technology Complex was finished in time for the fall 2013 semester and represents the last of the major Measure X projects. Buildings 700 and 900 were both extensively remodeled inside and out, and they now house the permanent spaces for the Administration of Justice, welding, cosmetology, automotive, and machining programs, among others. The dedication and ribbon cutting for the Fullerton College Technology Complex took place December 6, 2013.


As we close out our oversight of this bond program, I would like to again stress the tremendous leadership and conscientious management of the North Orange County Community College District. Not only have they been completely transparent throughout the development process, in February of this year the administration chose to take advantage of historically low interest rates to refinance bonds from its Measure X authorization without extending the term of those bonds. The District was able to reduce the interest rates on the prior bonds from an average of 5.00% to 2.02%, reducing the community's tax bill by approximately \$1 million per year for 10 years for a total of more than \$10 million over the life of the refinancing. The District will not receive any part of the savings. The NOCCCD board and administration pursued this opportunity strictly on behalf of local taxpayers as part of their continued support for the education of the students of its community.

Thank you again for your support and investment in NOCCCD's premier institutions: Cypress College, Fullerton College, and the School of Continuing Education. The funding provided by Measure X has ensured that quality higher education remains in our communities for generations to come.
